When Harlem Saved a King is a 90 minute Documentary produced by JIREH Management Group Productions. When Harlem Saved A King will tell a story not known by many Americans both young and not-so-young. It is a laser-focus examination of the events leading up to and following September 20, 1958, the day Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. was stabbed in the chest with a letter opener by a black woman named Izola Ware Curry. The stabbing occurred during Dr. King's first book signing, "Stride Towards Freedom: The Montgomery Story" at a Jewish department store in Harlem on 125th Street. When Harlem Saved a King will take viewers back to 1958 in a 48 hour style mystery to both engage and educate the audience while exploring the answers to the questions: Who was Izola Ware Curry and, what happened to her after the assassination attempt? Was there a conspiracy to kill Dr. King? Could the stabbing have an effect/impact on the Civil Rights Movement? What would have happened had Dr. King sneezed?
